Beaver Investitures

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
Beaver Scout Promise:

Beaver Uniform

This is available to buy from the <u>National Scout Shop</u> or <u>Leicestershire</u> <u>Scout Shop</u>. There are also other accessories include hats and hoodies available.

The red necker represents East Goscote Scouts. This will be given to the Beaver upon investiture along with their woggle. The woggle represents the Lodge (group) they are a part of. **There is a £7.50 investiture fee to be paid before investiture.** This is to cover the cost of the badges and necker.

Please make sure all uniform pieces, including the necker, are named as it all looks the same.

Uniform should be worn to all meetings unless stated otherwise. In addition to this, please ensure the young person dresses appropriately for the weather as we could be doing activities outside.

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We meet on a Wednesday at 7:15pm until 8:45pm.

We run a varied programme of activities and try to complete all the Challenge badges so the young person has the opportunity to earn their Chief Scouts Silver Award.

Cub Uniform

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Cub uniform includes a dark green sweatshirt, dark green t-shirt and dark trousers/shorts.

This is available to buy from the <u>National Scout Shop</u> or <u>Leicestershire Scout</u> <u>Shop</u>. There are also other accessories include hats and hoodies available.

The red necker represents East Goscote Scouts. This will be given to the Cub upon investiture along with their woggle. The woggle represents the Six (group) they are a part of. There is an investiture fee to be paid before investiture. This is either £7.50 with a new necker or £5 if a new necker is not required. This also covers the cost of the badges.

Please make sure all uniform pieces, including the necker, are named as it all looks the same.

Uniform should be worn to all meetings unless stated otherwise. In addition to this, please ensure the young person dresses appropriately for the weather as we could be doing activities outside.



Cubs Parental Rota 0000

In order for our Cub Pack to run safely, there are ratios that we need to keep to. We do this by automatically allocating you a week to help. This will be done in advance.

If you are unable to attend your allocated week then this would need to be swapped.

On odd occasions we may need more help, for example if we are leaving the Scout Hut for an activity. Many thanks in advance as we know your time is precious, but your help is really needed and valued.

There are also East Goscote Scout Group hoodies and tshirts available to buy. If you wish to purchase one, please contact one of the Leaders.



Moving Between Sections



When it is time for your young person to move onto the next stage in their Scouting adventure, your section's Team Leader will be in touch about the process and how we can support your young person with the transition.

There is an investiture fee to be paid before investiture. This is either £7.50 with a new necker or £5 if a new necker is not required. This also covers the cost of the badges.

The young person will also get the opportunity to earn their Moving On Award. There is one for each section.



Attendance

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When arriving with your young person, please ensure there is a Leader present and they are happy for you to leave.

If your child is unable to attend a meeting, please let the Team Leader know before the meeting.

If your child would like to leave Scouting altogether, please let the Team Leader know so their place can be given to another child. Please encourage your young person to come to all meetings. We plan our activities around gaining badges and some things we can't catch up with if it is missed.

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Expectations of Parents

The support of all parents is crucial in ensuring that Scouts runs well and your young person can get the most out of it. Keep up to date with any communication sent out.

Return all letters and forms by the date requested. Where appropriate this also includes ensuring any payments reach us by the date requested.

Informing us of anything that is likely to affect your child's involvement in Scouting, for example a change of address/contact details and any additional needs.

Remember that all Leaders are volunteers and freely give their time.

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Lastly, our Board Of Trustees that governs our Scout Group has the opportunity for a parent representative from each Section. This is to represent the young people from that section. If this is something you are interested in, please speak to Sarah Haywood at <u>chair@eastgoscotescouts.org.uk</u>.

Money

An investiture fee is paid before your child's investiture to cover the cost of necker and badges given at the investiture ceremony. This is either £7.50 with a new necker or £5 if a new necker is not required.

Subs help us to ensure our building and equipment is safe for the young people to use and allow us to organise exciting activities.

Non payment of subs may result in your child being asked to leave the group. It is our group policy that subscriptions are non-refundable and non-transferable.

Sometimes there are additional charges for activities outside of the hut. We try to keep these charges to a minimum and always subsidise trips where possible. Examples of additional costs can be found on our website. £7.50 investiture fee. £174 annual subs in 12 monthly instalments of £14.50.

Gift Aid

Gift Aid is tax relief set up by the Government to enable charities to claim back 25p for every eligible £1 donation that is made to your charity. Every Scout Group is a registered charity, therefore we are also able to claim 25% on eligible donations. A key requirement is the person UK paying must be а taxpayer.

When creating your direct debit for payments on OSM, you will be asked to declare if you are a UK taxpayer and if you would like to opt into Gift Aid. If you choose to opt in, there are no extra costs to yourself, but it will really help our Group's finances and cut down the pressure on the essential fundraising!

Anyone is welcome to volunteer within Scouting, whether this is occasionally or even weekly. We are always looking for new help. Without adult supporters, the young people wouldn't be able to attend.

Volunteers help for many different reasons, some include:

- Because volunteering is a 'good thing'
- As an enabler, so the Leader can do more
- To spend more quality time with your child
- To develop your own skills
- To make friends and meet new people
- To try something new and challenge yourself
- To create vital opportunities for young people
- To enjoy and rediscover adventure for yourself
- To make memories that'll last a lifetime.

Scouting Trustees

As a charity, each Scout Group is also governed by a group of trustees, including a chairperson, treasurer, and a parental representative. A clerk supports the trustees by recording the minutes.

They are crucial in ensuring our Scout Group can function whilst the Leaders run the weekly meetings.

Some of their key responsibilities include money management of group accounts, building management, fundraising and representing the young people.

Trustees meet once a month meaning the hours are more flexible for volunteers. We are always looking for new, creative ideas to improve our Scout Group. If you would like to know more, please contact our Chair, Sarah Haywood, <u>chair@eastgoscotescouts.org.uk</u>.

Health and Safety

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The Scout Association takes pride in its safety record. Leaders complete extensive training on safety, including risk assessments. There is the <u>Purple Card</u> which also sets out the emergency procedure. Support and guidance is also provided to all Leaders from the District and County. Key risk assessments can be found on our <u>website</u>.

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The Scout Association rules stipulate that no young person is allowed to undertake any activity without a Health Information Form.

For regular activities, we ask that each young person's parent/guardian completes a Member Details form, which is kept on file by the section's Team Leader. Occasionally, we may run activities that involve food and drink, for example offering the young person a biscuit and squash or a cooking night. Therefore, **it is important that we know if your child has any dietary requirements or allergies.**

Other Activities:

Some other activities, such as camps, you will be asked for another health form.

Some will also require a permission form, such as archery and shooting. These include a health information section, please include anything you think may be relevant to the activity.

For more adventurous activities such as water sports, caving and mountaineering, we have special authorisation arrangements to ensure Scouts are in safe hands.

Safeguarding

The safety of your young person is paramount to us in Scouting. The Scout Association's child protection policy is known as the 'Young People First' policy. It's often referred to as the 'Y<u>ellow</u> <u>Card</u>' policy because of the pocket sized reminder card all adults are asked to keep and carry with them. It is an example of best practice and praised by child protection agencies.

All Leaders have Safeguarding training which is renewed every 3 years. DBS checks are renewed every 5 years. Adults, including parent helpers, who have not completed a Scouting DBS will never be left alone with young people.

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Safeguarding Commitments

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The Scout Association is committed to:

- Taking into account, in all it's considerations and activities, the interests and well-being of young people;
- Respecting the rights, wishes and feelings of the young people with whom it is working;
- Taking all reasonable practicable steps to protect them from physical, sexual and emotional abuse, and
- Promoting the welfare of young people and their protection within a relationship of trust.

It is the policy of The Scout Association to safeguard the welfare of all members by protecting them from physical, sexual and emotional harm.

GDPR and Data Protection

GDPR and Data Protection is the responsibility of anyone who has access to the personal data of individuals. Therefore, all Leaders and Trustees follow The Scout Association <u>policy</u> and participate in mandatory training every 3 years.

What information do we hold?

The data we hold is classed as personal or sensitive. Personal data comprises of Name, Date of Birth, Address, email and phone numbers. Sensitive data such as Health records, Religion etc.

Why do we hold this data?

Personal and Sensitive Data is gathered to fulfil the requirements of the joining process.

Data gathered is for Health and Safety reasons and to understand the needs of the Young People in Scouting.

Where do we hold this data?

The data we hold is kept in different ways for different reasons. All data is kept in a secure location which is locked or password protected (Eg, One Drive Cloud storage, Online Scout Manager). As a Scout Group, we ensure that we comply with GDPR and PECR EU regulations regarding Personal Data. We will **never** pass your personal details to any third party without your specific consent.

Occasionally, we may need paper data records, for example during a camp where there is no WIFI/data signal. If this is the case, they too will be stored securely.

How long is data stored for?

Data is kept until the Young Person leaves or moves to the next section.
